## **Basketball Shooting Team Sports Rubric**

This rubric will help to grade skill level of students in the basketball shot. To achieve a skill number, students must demonstrate all of the skills in that scoring level. Emphasis is on the process and mechanics of the sports skill during intense game situations.

# Skill Number

## Mechanics and Cues of Skill

1

#### **Basic Skill Level**

- Student picks up dribble before the shooting spot
- Student does not make a complete stop and rushes shot
- Student does not bend knees or fully use lower body
- Vision is not focused on target/basket
- Student shoots with both hands on the side of the ball
- Student shoots ball as soon as someone gets close to them

### Elementary Skill Level

- Student dribbles the ball all the way to the shooting spot
- Student makes a complete stop but body is not fully balanced
- Student's hands are on correct spot on the basketball
- Student does not bend knees or fully use lower body (causes student to not shoot properly)
- Student's vision is at the basket while shooting
- Student waits for defense to recover before shooting

#### Advanced Skill Level

- Student dribbles the ball all the way to the shooting spot
- Student makes a complete stop and balances their body
- Student bends knees and uses lower body during shot
- Student's hands are on correct spot on the basketball
- Student's vision is at the basket while shooting
- Student shoots as soon as they are open

## **Exemplar Skill Level**

- Student is balanced and releases the ball at the apex of their jump shot
- Student uses a pump fake to get the defense in the air to shoot
- Student is able to shoot with defense in their face
- Student able to shoot a fade away jumper and can use the backboard
- Student is able to use a plethora of different shots to score
- Student doesn't rely on the 3 pointer
- Student can use both hands equally well during a game from 15 feet in
