





This rubric will help to grade skill level of students in batting mechanics. To achieve a skill number, students must demonstrate all of the skills in that scoring level. Emphasis is on the process and mechanics of the sports skill and not the end product.

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Skill Number	Mechanics and Cues of Skill				
1	 Student has non-dominant hand-on-top and hands are not close together Students legs are not shoulder width apart Bat is not brought back away from the students body Student does not take a step before swinging 				
2	 Elementary Skill Level Student has dominant hand-on-top grip but hands may not be close together Students legs are not shoulder width apart Bat is up-and-back away from students body but not back far enough Student takes a small step with their front foot or no step before they swing 				
3	 Intermediate Skill Level Student has dominant hand-on-top grip and hands are close together Students legs are shoulder width apart Bat is up-and-back away from students body but not back far enough Student takes a small step with their front foot before they swing 				
4	Exemplar Skill Level Student has dominant hand-on-top grip and hands are close together Students legs are shoulder width apart				

Bat is up-and-back away from students body and shoulders Student takes a large step with their front foot before they swing
